Article in a Weekly Publication (magazine)	<p>Author. "Name of Article." <i>Title of Magazine</i> . Complete Date: Pages of Article. Print.</p>	<p>Madison, Laura. "Is Brittany Spears Making a Comeback?" <i>People</i>, 12 Nov. 2008: 6-7. Print.</p>	<p>Instead of including volume and issue #, you will plug in the whole date of the issue. Abbreviate the month as always.</p>
Article in a Monthly Publication (magazine)	<p>Author. "Name of Article." <i>Title of Magazine</i> . Month(s) it covers. Year: Pages of Article. Print.</p>	<p>Alford, Jeffery. "Cook Like You Mean It". <i>Bon Appetite</i> . Jan.-Feb. 1992: 44-45. Print.</p>	<p>Don't include a whole date; just plug in the month(s) that the source covers. Always abbreviate.</p>
Newspaper Article	<p>Author. "Name of Article." <i>Title of Newspaper</i> . Complete Date: Page. Print.</p>	<p>Miller, David. "Gang Injunction Angers a Neighborhood." <i>Seattle Times</i> . 5 Jan. 1992: C2. Print.</p>	<p>Newspaper pages usually have both a letter and a number. For Website Newspaper, follow the directions for print, but include the website address. If the city of publication is not part of the newspaper's name, add it in square brackets: News and Observer [Raleigh, NC].</p>
