

## Bibliography Format Chart: MLA 7 Citation Style

Music or Spoken words from a CD or tape cassette.	<b>Artist/Speaker. "Name of Song / Lecture." <i>Name of Album.</i> Publisher, Date of Publication. CD.</b>	<b>Coltrane, John. "Giant Steps." <i>The Last Giant: The John Coltrane Anthology.</i> Rhino Records, 1993. CD.</b>	If someone else sings the song, write <b>Perf. Name of Performer</b> after the Name of Album. Perf. (Example: Perf. Justin Timberlake)
Internet and Website	<b>Author. "Title of the Webpage." <i>Title of the Website.</i> Source who published it. Web. Day Month Year you accessed it. &lt;Website address&gt;.</b>	<b>Landers, Tim. "Who Says Money Isn't Everything." <i>All About Money.</i> The Money Institute. Web. 6 Apr. 2006. &lt;<a href="http://www.moneyinstitute.com">http://www.moneyinstitute.com</a>&gt;.</b>	Not all websites have an author; if there isn't one, start with the webpage title.

### General Tips:

1. All entries should be double-spaced!!!! The examples above are not double spaced to save space, but your bibliographies should always be double-spaced!
2. *Italicize* all titles.
3. Indent all lines after the first. Don't indent the first line.
4. Abbreviate all months except for May, June, and July.
5. Always write the date in this format: Day Month Year (31 Aug. 2008.)
6. Always put the website address inside <>.
7. Your first line may include more or less information than the examples depending on your print size and margins; keep writing your bibliography on the first line until you have no more room---you may only need 1 line!
8. If there is no page listed, write n. pag.  
 If there is no publisher, write N.p.  
 If there is no date, write n. d.
